
PORTERS, SAILORS, SKINNERS, SMITHS AND TILLERS. And we not only have SOWERS but SEEDS to accompany them

If you haven't signed into MyMPPC before, you will need to request a login at mppc. net/mymppc-questions.

OR

Follow These Steps Once Logged Into MyMPPC:

- 1. Click "Community." (left menu)
- 2. Click "Groups."
- 3. Click "Find Groups."
- 4. Click "Lenten Small Groups."
- 5. Scroll through the groups marked 2018. Find an "Open" group that meets your needs, then click the name.
- **6. Click on the button "Join Group."** This will send a message to the group facilitator to add your name to their group. Please allow some time for the facilitator to do this.

After the facilitator adds you to the group, you will be able to see the name of the group in the drop-down menu under Groups on MyMPPC. You will also receive a confirmation email from your group facilitator.

If you try to join a group that has become full, the facilitator should send you a message letting you know so you can find another group.

If you are having difficulty finding a group that meets your needs, please let Rev. Kim Trimboli know (ktrimboli@mppc.net).

- 7. Purchase the Study Book: John: The Gospel of Light and Life by Adam Hamilton in the church office (\$10, cash/check). Read the first chapter for your first meeting!
- 8. Enjoy your fellow group members' companionship, and a good Lenten practice for deepening your relationship with God.





Village Concert Series: Charleston Symphony Orchestra Quartet


