"Day and night without ceasing they sing, 'Holy, holy, holy, the Lord God the Almighty, who was and is and is to come.' ... They cast their crowns before the throne, singing, ¹¹'You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things...'" (Revelation 4:8-11)

Worship is the central act of the Christian faith. For centuries, young Presbyterians have learned this lesson in the very first question of the Westminster Shorter Catechism: "What is the chief end of man?" the confession asks. "Man's chief end," it quickly answers, "is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever." In worship, we tap into the very core of our being and do what is most natural for us — giving joyful praise and honor to the Holy One who creates us, sustains us, and loves us without fail.

As Presbyterians, we also believe that there is not one "right" way to worship. Some worship styles are relatively fixed, tracking closely with certain established forms, practices, and patterns. Other modes claim more freedom, seeking to provide plenty of room for inspiration and creative expression.

Because not everyone worships the same way, and because everyone experiences God differently, we are fortunate to offer two distinct worship styles here at MPPC. Our sanctuary services tend to follow more traditional forms, while our Net service has embraced a more informal style with respect to music and language. Both of these forms of worship honor God, and both of them are quenching the spiritual thirst of our worshiping community in their own ways. My hope, prayer, and intention as your pastor is that both of these forms of worship – sanctuary and Net – will not only survive but thrive as integral parts of our congregational life.

While our forms of worship may vary, we do find common ground when it comes to the "marks" of authentic Christian worship. We may choose different music, instruments, language, and levels of formality, but we all share these values as Presbyterians standing in the Reformed tradition:

<u>The Word</u>. First and foremost, we believe that worship is "rooted" in scripture. We consider the "reading, hearing, preaching, and affirming" of the Word of God to be both "central" and "essential" to true worship (*Book of Order*, W-3.0301).



- <u>The Sacraments</u>. Word and Sacrament are closely linked in our theology. The ritual acts of baptism and the Lord's Supper, instituted by Christ and given life by the Holy Spirit, inspire us, feed us, and seal us as God's own. Even when we are not celebrating these rituals on a given Sunday, we are encouraged to make the symbols that represent them (font, cup, and plate) visibly prominent in our worship spaces.
- <u>Prayer</u>. Prayer, we believe, "is at the heart of worship." There are many ways to pray, and there are many kinds of prayer, including adoration, thanksgiving, confession, supplication, intercession, and dedication. Faithful prayer, however, is always shaped by scripture and always "inspires us to join God's work in the world" (*Book of Order*, W-2.0202).
- <u>Self-Offering</u>. Having been given new life in "the costly self-offering of Jesus Christ," the people of the church respond by offering Jesus "our lives, our spiritual gifts, and our material goods." Each and every service of worship therefore includes opportunities to respond with our own self-offerings (*Book of Order*, W-3.041). This includes the music and song that we offer, both individually and together, as an act of thanksgiving and praise to God.

Around these basic principles of worship, we will continue to embrace the creative freedom given to us in Jesus Christ. In the sanctuary, in the Net, and out into the world, we will continue to pursue together our primary goal and end -- "to glorify God and enjoy him forever." Blessings and peace,



They still have hurdles to overcome. But as he told one Hope House volunteer, he knows they have a fighting chance because of the kindness he was shown by our church community.

His wife also felt that welcoming spirit when they attended a Sunday service with Hope House director Beth Moore. Both were so appreciative of the love and kindness shown by each church member they met.
