Adult faith formation takes on COVID-19 social distancing this fall with more than 20 offerings! From small groups to Presbyterian Women to men's studies scattered throughout the week, there are opportunities we hope will meet many of the congregation's needs as we grow into discipleship. Bytes of faith

And we invite you to try something new this fall too called **Bytes of Faith**.

Bytes of Faith are short, creative video clips staff and church leaders create that show our real selves, but also engage viewers in the biblical story. Think of the **Bytes of Faith** as digital children's messages, messages with meat that grab the attention of both young and old. They are talking points for in-home faith formation. They tell a story that connects life with Scripture and engages families with an activity and life application. They are short, focused and intentional.

For instance, I might talk about my mom who had dementia and Alzheimer's. I went to visit her once and she was so excited to see me. After we ate lunch together, I brought her to the common area of her care facility and stepped away for a few minutes. When I returned, my mom was so excited to see me, like we hadn't seen each other in months! She was even ready to eat again! Wouldn't it be wonderful if the church welcomed each other like my mom welcomed me!

Bytes of Faith begins by families "inviting" us (the storytellers) into your home for conversations and digital viewing. As social distancing begins to lift, we encourage you to invite other families into your home for **Bytes of Faith** together. These **Bytes of Faith** moments can happen on Sundays, weekdays, day or night, but they are real, and they are connected to the church today and to the church tomorrow. It is a "new" old way of doing church and faith formation.

In September we will provide an introductory video that invites you to *Bytes of Faith*. October will feature our first *Bytes of Faith* message. These will be available on the 7th of each month and can be accessed on our church web site under *Bytes of Faith*. New *Bytes of Faith* will be added, and old messages stored on the site in case you want to share the videos with others or view them again. We hope you will invite us into your homes this fall for some *Bytes of Faith*. We also hope you will invite others into your home to have conversations sparked by the stories and messages of *Bytes of Faith*. Think of it as a type of "house church" focused on Christian Education, maybe like the early church in Acts.

CONNECT 3 - 9 a.m.

While this Sunday School class typically meets during the last Service of Worship (10:30 a.m.), it currently meeting via **Zoom** at 9 a.m. and offers conversation and discussion geared around Scripture and contemporary studies. From books of the Bible to topical studies, this class offers life application insight into each lesson.

The overall purpose of the Academy of St. John class is to equip God's people for a more effective missional presence in, and engagement of, the world through: expanding our knowledge and understanding of Biblical revelation and our theological heritage, deepening our spiritual life and growing in Christ-likeness, cultivating our love of God and the embodiment of that love in service and mission to our neighbor, enlarging knowledge and appreciation of the diversity in Christian belief and practice, understanding the implications of the Christian faith for the critical issues faced in the world, and becoming more knowledgeable about the unique dimensions of our denominational identity. Sundays, 9 a.m. via **Zoom**. Fall studies include *Max Lucado's You'll Get Through This, N. T. Wright's Mark for Everyone,* and *Max Lucado's Advent study Because of Bethlehem.*

SEEKERS AND SOWERS - 9

In Hebrews: Grace and Gratitude. author and New Testament scholar David deSilva takes participants through a study of Hebrews, tracing the themes of grace and gratitude through this unique New Testament book. In the Book of Hebrews. participants will discover a bold perspective on who Jesus is and what he has done, as well as a powerful reflection on the meaning and significance of his death and resurrection in light of the Old Testament. As you read and study this letter, you will receive a deeper appreciation for the salvation we have received through Christ and hear afresh God's call to a life of gratitude and faithfulness. THE HARBOR - 9 a.m.

The Harbor is an in-depth Bible study that includes presentation and discussion. Past studies include the history of Christianity and Moses. The books of Exodus and Numbers are on tap for the fall. Meets Sundays, 9 a.m. via **Zoom**.

MEN AND WOMEN'S SMALL GROUP - 4 p.m.

Men and women of all ages are welcome to join this study of God's Word that meets weekly on Sundays, 4 p.m. via **Zoom**. Past study included N.T. Wright's study on Philippians.

INTO THE LIGHT: FINDING HOPE THROUGH PRAYERS OF LAMENT - 1st Sundays - 7 p.m.

Most Christians read the Bible for comfort, instruction, and inspiration. Yet the Bible is also a resource that gives us permission to raise our voices to God in pain, anger, protest, and grief. During these challenging days of COVID-19 and Black Lives Matter, we can be grateful to PCUSA Presbyterian Women for offering the Horizons Bible Study as a resource for appropriating lament in our faith experience. The class will be taught by the pastors along with Director of Christian Education Dan Wiard on a rotating basis. Participants may wish to obtain a copy of the Horizons Bible Study Into the Light: Finding Hope Through Prayers of Lament although this is not required. If you are a circle Bible leader or a circle member who will miss your monthly meeting, you especially will value the monthly study session. And take note: the class is NOT for women only, but for anyone who wishes to deepen one's relationship to God through Bible study and prayer. First Sunday of each month,

Philippians: Six Themes Everyone Should Know. Philippi is Paul's first destination outside Asia Minor, his first city to visit in Europe, and his first mission in a place where there was no Jewish community from which to begin preaching. Cynthia Campbell writes that in Paul's letter to the Philippians, we get a unique glimpse of our beginnings as Christians. Some themes explored include the importance of community for followers of Christ, Christian joy despite persecution, the nature of Christian unity, what it means to be "in Christ", and mutual hospitality. Wednesdays, 10 a.m. **Begins September 16.**

GET FED: THE NEW TESTAMENT IN ITS WORLD - 7 p.m. Sept. 23 – Nov. 11

Hosted on **Zoom**, *The New Testament in Its World* is your passageway from the twenty-first century to the era of Jesus and the first Christians. Our study brings together decades of ground-breaking research, writing, and teaching that will open readers' eyes to the larger world of the New Testament. It presents the New Testament books as historical, literary,

and social phenomena located in the world of Second Temple Judaism, amidst Greco-Roman politics and culture, and within early Christianity. Questions we will address include, but are not limited to:

- · What is the purpose of the New Testament?
- What was the first century understanding of the kingdom?
- What is the real meaning of the resurrection in its original context?
- · What really were the Gospels?
- Who was Paul and why are his letters so controversial?
- As twenty-first-century people, how do we recover the excitement of what it was like to live as Christians in the first or second centuries?

GET FED: MISSIONAL RENAISSANCE - 7 p.m. Sept. 23 - Nov. 11

Hosted on **Zoom**, join Pastor Bart as we discuss and learn about Missional Renaissance, a way of reframing what it means to be a missional church. Using Reggie McNeal's classic book *Missional Renaissance* as our guide, McNeal identifies in this study three major shifts that must take place in the Church if it is to live into its God-given potential. As Reggie puts it "The missional renaissance is changing the way the people of God think about God and the world, about what God is up to in the world and what part the people of God play in it." He notes that there are three cultural phenomena that are fueling this renaissance:

 The emergence of the altruism economy: people's determination not only to share their wealth but to make a difference with it

- The search for personal growth: the unprecedented pursuit of personal development...a pervasive sense of needing to grow, to learn, to adapt, and to change that has become part of the psyche of our culture
- The hunger for spiritual vitality: a spirituality robust enough to engage people where they live, work, and play

This study will include a wide-ranging discussion about what means for us to call ourselves a Missional Church and how might we be in a time of reframing and reforming in a Missional Renaissance.

WOMEN'S SMALL GROUP: Unshakeable Hope - 6 p.m.

*Curriculum Description for 2020-2021 Presbyterian Wornen/Horizons Bible Study

Into the Light: Finding Hope Through Prayers of Lament. In this nine-lesson study, Lynn Miller revives lament as a proper theological response to the difficult situations of our world. One of the foundational points of the study is that, in scripture, lament usually leads to hope. After crying out to God, the one who laments remembers God. And while that does not fix things in the moment—the injustice, the loss still exists—the lamenter is strengthened to face the world and to hope. And for us as Christians, hope is not just an emotional response or an attitude of pie in the sky. Hope implies movement: both God's inherent movement toward justice and our movement toward God. Recovering lament may be one of the church's most timely gifts to the world.


