Rally Day

"⁴Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. ⁵You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. ⁶Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. ⁶Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. ⁶Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, ⁰and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."
(Deuteronomy 6:4-8)

Torah, known as "the Shema," are some of the most precious words in all of Judaism. And, for thousands of years,

These verses from the

devout families have taken them literally.
As a reminder that the love of God must always be the highest

and most important goal in

human life, these verses are printed on a small piece of parchment paper, which is then rolled up and inserted into a decorative cylinder called a *mezuzah*. The *mezuzah* is then affixed to the doorpost of the home, so that, in each moment of coming and going, each morning and each night, God's people can place their hands upon a small physical talisman to remind them of who they are... and *whose* they are.

This month, even though we continue to experience physical separation in these difficult and trying times, we will still be observing our own reminder of the Shema.

Each September in the church, we set aside a Sunday to kickstart another year of education, fellowship, and shared discipleship. Some churches call it "Rally Day;" others call it "Promotion Sunday." Regardless of the name, the purpose is the same. The duty to pass true and authentic faith on to our children, and to remind ourselves of what we are really about, is a sacred calling for every disciple. On that Lord's Day, we can recommit ourselves to God and to the church. We can proclaim together our faith that the Lord our God really is the highest goal and guiding star of our lives. We can claim again the hope that the law of love will be written upon our hearts, and that we will ponder that love at home and away, when we lie down and when we rise.

I pray that this ancient perspective will capture you, bless you, and turn your faces toward God in the season to come. Hear, O church, the Lord your God is calling!

Our own Glenn Hair, MPPC's Finance Director, shared a story of a homeless couple he met. As a result, some of our members have helped this couple out while they are living in a broken- down panel truck.

Hope House volunteers believe, "God is working through all of us to help each other, even when our world is in crisis. Shifting the focus of our own worries to those with greater needs is like breathing a breath of fresh air!"

Faith Formation in a New Time

The believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers. A sense of awe came over everyone. God performed many wonders and signs through the apostles...Every day, they met together in the temple and ate in their homes. They shared food with gladness and simplicity. They praised God and demonstrated God's goodness to everyone. The Lord added daily to the community those who were being saved. (Acts 2:42-47)

Adult faith formation takes on COVID-19 social distancing this fall with more than 20 offerings! From small groups to Presbyterian Women to men's studies scattered throughout the week, there are opportunities we hope will meet many of the congregation's needs as we grow into discipleship. And we invite you to try something new this fall too called *Bytes of Faith*.

Bytes of Faith are short, creative video clips staff and church leaders create that show our real selves, but also engage viewers in the biblical story. Think of the Bytes of Faith as digital children's messages, messages with meat that grab the attention of both young and old. They are talking points for in-home faith formation. They tell a story that connects life with Scripture and engages families with an activity and life application. They are short, focused and intentional.

For instance, I might talk about my mom who had dementia and Alzheimer's. I went to visit her once and she was so excited to see me. After we ate lunch together, I brought her to the common area of her care facility and stepped away for a few minutes. When I returned, my mom was so excited to see me, like we hadn't seen each other in months! She was even ready to eat again! Wouldn't it be wonderful if the church welcomed each other like my mom welcomed me!

Bytes of Faith begins by families "inviting" us (the storytellers) into your home for conversations and digital viewing. As social distancing begins to lift, we encourage you to invite other families into your home for **Bytes of Faith** together.

These *Bytes of Faith* moments can happen on Sundays, weekdays, day or night, but they are real, and they are connected to the church today and to the church tomorrow. It is a "new" old way of doing church and faith formation.

In September we will provide an introductory video that invites you to *Bytes of Faith*. October will feature our first *Bytes of Faith* message. These will be available on the 7th of each month and can be accessed on our church web site under *Bytes of Faith*. New *Bytes of Faith* will be added, and old messages stored on the site in case you want to share the videos with others or view them again. We hope you will invite us into your homes this fall for some *Bytes of Faith*. We also hope you will invite others into your home to have conversations sparked by the stories and messages of *Bytes of Faith*. Think of it as a type of "house church" focused on Christian Education,

maybe like the early church in Acts.

As we gear up for a Fall unlike any other at MPPC, there are exciting things happening in CornerStone Youth Ministry. We had such great success with CornerStone this Summer that we are going to continue it through the program year. The youth will be participating in something every week, whether that's CORE Group Bible study (the new version of Sunday School) or BIG Group youth gatherings (the new version of Youth Group).

Beginning on September 13th, the youth who participated in Peer2Peer groups this summer will continue to explore and develop their faith in the same pattern we created over the summer months. CORE groups will be made up of about 30 youth and BIG group will be the entire youth group together.
