What happens during "interim time?"

I prefer to call this the time of transition. William Bridges pointed out that there is a difference between change and

transition (Bridges, William. Managing Transitions. Making the Most of Change. Nicholas Brealey Publishing, London/ Boston).

Change happens in our environment, e.g. a new job, a move, a birth, a death, a pastor leaving. In other words, external events. Transition has to do with an inner, psychological re-orientation of selfredefinition.

Every transition has three phases:

Phase One: The Ending

Unless people can make a real ending. they will be unable to make a successful beginning. You must let go of old things and attachments — not just outwardly, but inwardly too — before you can pick a new one. The first phase is the difficult process of letting go of old behaviors, realities, loyalties, attitudes. Letting go of the old situation allows one to enter a neutral zone.

Phase Two: The Neutral Zone

The neutral zone is a dangerous time for organizations (and churches). In this zone we decide intentionally what we are leaving behind and determine our losses. Participants in this phase are often in denial, shock, confused, angry, frustrated, cynical, desperate, and all the emotions we experience during times of grief.

Gradually these emotions are worked through and understood, and give way to acceptance, hope and enthusiasm. It is also a time of creativity and new energy, a time when innovations and experiments have an especially good chance of succeeding.

Phase Three: A New Beginning

After going through each of these first two phases of transition, people can deal successfully with the final phase — a new beginning. People engage with new energy, establish new roles, and have a sense of purpose. With a new outlook, we begin to understand the part we play, and how to contribute and participate most effectively.

I've listened to many of you, and your experiences of what has happened since the beginning of this millennium. I've realized that we haven't entered a neutral zone just vet. We are still negotiating the ending. Thank you for everyone who made time to talk to me. Please continue to discuss your different experiences with me in person, or per email or a telephone call. Through these conversations, we will be able to move forward to start a new beginning together.



seven words - a lenten journey



During Lent, small groups at Mount Pleasant Presbyterian Church will be gathering around the passages from the gospels that have traditionally been called the seven last words of Jesus. Worship services during this holy

season also will focus on these offerings from Scripture.

ASH WEDNESDAY March 2

"Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." – Luke 23: 34

The Lenten Journey from the ashes of death to resurrected life begins on the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday. The ashes which are placed on our foreheads in the shape of the cross symbolize our mortality, the brokenness of our lives, and our need for forgiveness.

At MPPC, we will begin our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, March 2, with the first of the SEVEN WORDS, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34)

The sanctuary will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. You are invited to receive the imposition of ashes from a pastor at any time during those hours. At the beginning of each hour, the church bell will be rung followed by a five-minute liturgy of Scripture and prayer.

A worship service which will include music, a brief homily, and the imposition of ashes will begin in the sanctuary at 7:00 p.m.

2022 Lenten Small Group Study

This year we use the book Seven Words: Listening to Christ from the Cross, by Susan Robb, as our Lenten small group study. Robb says, "Jesus's last words, uttered as he was dying on Good Friday, offer us the opportunity to lean in and listen closely for messages that are for us. These statements, collected from the various Gospel accounts, have traditionally been called the seven last words of Jesus. It is particularly important to listen to them during Lent because Jesus calls on us to go

on the same journey that led him to Golgotha."

It's not too late to join a small group this Lent! Small Groups will meet for six-weeks during Lent. Each gathering lasts about 1 hour and includes fellowship and discussion using the Seven Words book. Some of the groups will meet via Zoom, others in-person, and groups are scattered throughout the week. Participants can sign up for specific or "open" small groups

via Realm or by contacting Trish Snead at the church. You can access and signup for a group facilitator through your Realm account by going to community/groups/2022 Lent Small Groups. An "open" group means that you are interested in that small group format (in-person or virtual) and are open to who facilitates your group. "Open" group registrants will be paired with a group.

Haiti Outreach Ministries 2021 Impact Report

God is at work through faithful friends like you.

A HOLISTIC APPROACH

HOM's vision is to develop **self-sustaining communities** that help people become the individuals God intended them to be. We achieve this through programs that address the spiritual, mental, physical, and economic needs of our Haitian brothers & sisters.

PHYSICAL HEALTH

10,800 PATIENTS received medical and dental care. MASTAS community health project began working with mothers in Repatriote to reduce maternal/child mortality and malnutrition.



ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

537 STUDENTS enrolled in two vocational schools. Began new partnership with Extollo International, providing masonry training as a stepping stone to construction workforce employment.

CLEAN WATER

620,000 GALLONS

of safe drinking water provided free to communities at four campus access points.



EDUCATION

2,030 STUDENTS enrolled in four schools and various universities. The Baryè Fè Secondary School added newly-built classrooms and now serves the final Haitian school year of 13th grade for the first time.

SPIRITUAL HEALTH

3,100 WORSHIPERS WEEKLY Funds successfully raised for Bible College to train new pastoral leaders (opening anticipated fall 2022).

CREATING ECONOMIC IMPACT

In 2021, HOM conducted six major construction projects, including adding new classrooms to the Baryè Fè secondary school and completing essential sitework on the new Espwa Campus. 100% of purchasing was done in Haiti, contributing economic impact in the following ways:

Skilled tradesmen and day laborers benefited from 13,139 days of employment during construction.



22

Local supply firms and subcontractors were engaged in the project.



\$903,642

Invested in Haiti through buying of construction supplies and materials and workers' wages.



Across ministry sectors, a total of 204 full and part time staff members were employed in 2021. This generated \$780,000 in wages, **creating a wave of economic benefit** as these earnings flowed down to employees' immediate families and networks.


