Traceable & Believable



Luke 2: In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered.

With this familiar verse begins one of the most important chapters in the history of humankind. It is a

familiar story, because Luke 2 is always read in worship during the Christmas period. Because we are familiar with this story, we may get careless when we read it again. And so, we do not take the time to worship and wonder at this event which changed the history and time keeping of the world.

The first seven verses of Luke 2 tell in an almost simplistic way how God became a human being in the person of the Son. The birth of our Lord is placed within certain historical events—the emperor was Augustus, and Quirinius was governor of Syria when there was a world-wide census.

We know that Publius Sulpicius Quirinius (also translated as Cyrenius) was appointed legate governor of Syria, to which the province of Judaea had been added for the purpose of a census.

Luke wants to ground his story firmly in the history of humankind—traceable, believable. But he wanted this story to be more than a mere lesson in history. In his version of the Jesus story, God's mercy and love for all people is revealed, how God put the exclamation point at the end of the love story when the Son died on the cross. And our story, which begins in the fields of Bethlehem, with politicians scheming and organizing, ends with the report that "... they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God (Lk 24:52–53.)

Where will your Christmas story end this year? My prayer is that Advent and Christmas will be filled with many memories, and with an experience which will end in all of us worshipping the living Christ, who showed us how much God loves all people.





Then people brought little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples rebuked them. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:13-14, NIV)

I wonder how you and I welcome children as part of the Body of Christ through MPPC. Do we do enough? Are our hearts truly open to welcoming little children? What does it mean to welcome children? MERRY CHRISTMAS from the CornerStone Youth





Advent Studies:

Three different Advent studies are happening on and around the MPPC campus this Advent. Even though they have started, you are invited to join any of the studies.

The Journey: Walking the Road to Bethlehem, by Adam Hamilton. In The Journey, Adam Hamilton travels from Nazareth to Bethlehem in a fascinating look at the birth of Jesus Christ. As he did with Jesus' crucifixion in 24 Hours That Changed the World, Hamilton once again approaches a world-changing event with thoughtfulness. Using historical information, archaeological data, and a personal look at some of the stories surrounding the birth, the most amazing moment in history will become more real and heart-felt as you walk along this road. (9:30 a.m., Connect 3 Sunday School Class, Parlor)

The Angels of Christmas: Hearing God's Voice in Advent, by Susan Robb, is a four-week Advent study that explores the four angelic visits surrounding the birth of Jesus with Zechariah, Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds. In this study, the reader explores the visits and dive deep into the history of the angel Gabriel–and other angels–in the Old Testament. The Angels of Christmas uses these four angelic appearances to discuss God's presence in history and our lives today. The messages of the angels hold meaning for listeners both then and now. (10 a.m., Youngish Adults in Seabrook 209, and The Middle in Grace Hall 226)

Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent, by Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. Join her as she traces the Christmas narrative through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem, and the visit from the Magi. These stories open conversations around connections of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt. 
Pastor Bart's Advent Challenge

From my sermon on Nov 27th the First Sunday of Advent, here are four ways to practice our faith, as we wait with awareness and anticipation for Christ's coming.

- 1. Select a drawer, closet, room, your garage, a space in your house or a rented storage unit, that needs cleaning out and organizing. This advent season clean it out-throw away what you don't need and donate what you can.
- 2. Find two things you own and love but never use. What friend or family member-or even a charitable organization-could use these special items?
- 3. Prepare an extra meal and give it to a neighbor or friend.
- 4. Place the MPPC Local Missions Volunteer Directory (mppc.net/volunteer) in a prominent place in your home. Review and discuss the catalog with your family and choose a volunteer opportunity you are passionate about. Then find ways you can give to that mission partner or serve them during advent and in 2023.

About Year End Giving:


The ministries of MPPC are dependent upon your financial generosity. Thank you for your participation in God's mission through your tithes and offerings. As we wind down 2022 and you plan your year-end giving, here are a few items of note:

- There are several ways to give, including cash, check, via a charitable trust, directly from your 401(K) account, online via ACH or credit card, or via stock transfer. If you're giving online, please note it is less expensive for the church if you use ACH (bank account and routing number).
- If you wish for your gift to be included on your 2022 giving statement, please be sure to begin the process as early in December as possible, especially for gifts of stock and 401(K) distributions. It takes several days for your broker to complete a stock transfer to our Morgan Stanley account, and generally a few weeks to process a 401(K) or charitable trust distribution.
- If you plan to mail a gift, it must be physically at MPPC or postmarked by December 31, 2022. You are encouraged to mail earlier rather than later due to possible USPS delays. If your gift is post-marked or dropped off after December 31, your gift will not appear on your 2022 giving statement.

Your donation to MPPC may qualify for an income tax deduction in accordance with Federal and/or State income tax laws. Please consult with your tax advisor to determine whether your donation is tax deductible in whole or in part. Nothing in this communication is intended to constitute legal or tax advice.
