#### **Congregational Nominating Committee**

Suggestions for next year's slate of officers will be received from the congregation and from the session until January 25, 2023. The committee will then begin its discernment process.

**Fellowship and Congregational Life** The Saturday Night Live meal program is off to a slow start attendance-wise in 2023. A chili cookoff will be held January 29.

**Missions Committee** The Wise Giving campaign raised \$17,292.00 for local and international missions. Water Missions International will present a program on January 29<sup>th</sup> the Sunday Night Live. A mission trip to build two buildings is planned for Honduras on February 21<sup>st</sup>. Jeff Taylor will be hosting this, and it will run two weeks back-to-back. Seven people have committed for the summer mission trip to Honduras to Lamb Institute.

**Personnel** A Youth Transition Team is in place. In the short term, Danie is serving as the point person for Youth Ministry Lynn Wiard is filling in 15-hours a week in the Children's Ministry. She reports directly to Danie, so as to avoid any conflict. Communications Director Logan's Garabato's husband has been transferred to Charlotte. She will relocate with him, but continue to work remotely,

returning to campus as needed. Bart Edwards is completing Transitional Pastor training.

**Property and Grounds Committee** One of the sanctuary HVAC units has stopped working and replacement/repair is being investigated. The new sexton is Wayne Stewart and is currently working his 6-month probationary period.

**Worship Committee** The Holy Week/Easter schedule is being planned for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. There will be three services on Easter: 9:00 am - The NET; and 10:00 am and 11:30 a.m. in the sanctuary with choir and brass. Attendance numbers are as follows.

#### **Finance & Stewardship**

To date, we have received 310 pledges for \$1,631,414.33 (285 for \$1,520,779 in 2022; of which\$1,404,371 or 93.66% was collected). In 2022, we budgeted for \$500,000 in unpledged giving and \$477,516 (95.5%) was collected.
