Good Words, but Which Are We?

Volunteer. Disciple. Good words that seem to have similar meanings in the Church. Both volunteers and disciples are critical to programming. They are the hands and feet of Christ and often are on the front lines of ministry. We volunteer to teach Sunday School, serve as a youth advisor, and help at Vacation Bible School. But when we're tired, if we see ourselves as a volunteer, we can walk away. If we don't agree with someone or something, we can walk away. We can stop volunteering until we decide to re-visit the opportunities. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, however, to walk away is to abandon Jesus and the mission to which we are called. When Jesus called his disciples, he said, "Come, follow me and I will make you fish for people." He didn't promise everything would be easy, but to follow Christ is the adventure of a lifetime that transforms one's life to something amazing.

While summer is a time for vacations and relaxing with family and friends, the choices we commit to in the church will shape the fall program and beyond. We are at junctions in our ministry because they are disciple led rather than staff led. Let me briefly outline the educational opportunities that need disciples for the fall. Beside each opportunity is the time commitment and a short description. Curriculum and supplies are provided. I believe our greatest, most impactful ministry with children and youth (see page 5) is done in teams where leaders develop a relationship with those he or she serves over the course of regular leadership and presence. Is that possible in today's culture? That is something you will help us decide together.

As you read through the opportunities, prayerfully consider how God might be calling you to serve in ministry. We are all part of the Body of Christ, each part needed to fulfill the ministry to which MPPC is called. Children's Ministry

Sunday School Teachers (Preschool – 5th grade)

– Sunday mornings, 1 hour, September-May. Preparation during the week. You learn about the Bible.

Sunday Night Live Leaders (Preschool-5th grade)

– Sunday evenings, 1.5 hours, September-May 6–8-week terms. You learn about the Bible in a less-structured format than in Sunday School.

Kids Praise! Leaders (K-2nd grade)– Sundays during 11:00 a.m. Service of Worship, 45 minutes, last three Sundays of the month. You will learn about Sunday's scripture in a child-friendly manner.

Children in Worship (3rd graders learn about worship)

– Sundays during 11:00 a.m. Service of Worship, 6-week elective, 1 hour, fall. You will discover the parts of worship and why we do what we do.

2nd Grade Bibles (children learn about the Bible)

– Wednesdays, 8-week elective, late afternoon, 2 hours. Intense course where you will learn your Bible and the books of the Bible in a fun, engaging, high energy format.

Children's Ministry Team – Monthly meetings (1-1.5 hours), plan and develop children's ministry programs listed above (time commitment varies). Reward is seeing the smiles on children's faces and how lives are being transformed.

Adult Ministry

Sunday School Teachers – Sunday mornings, 1 hour, September-May. Preparation during the week. You learn about the Bible.

Small Group Leaders (Lent and throughout the Year) – Various days, seasons, and time of the week which is often your choice. 1-1.5 hours per week in blocks of 6-8 weeks. Facilitator takes home great friendships and a richer knowledge of the Story.

Weekday Bible Study Leaders – Self-designed, can be connected to existing programs such as SNL or stand-alone opportunities.

Presbyterian Women and Presbyterian Men Groups

– Presbyterian Women has strong groups and is always open for more. The Men's group is in early stages of development of a core group of men to carry its ministry forward.

Adult Faith Formation Ministry Team – Monthly meetings (1-1.5 hours), plan and develop adult ministry programs listed above (time commitment varies). Reward is being part of a team that is transforming lives.

Christian Education Sessional Committee

– Monthly meetings (1-1.5 hours), coordinate and oversee the total education ministry of MPPC, including developing leaders to serve in children, youth, and adult ministries.

Summer Adult Sunday School 1 & 2 Peter and Jude (10 a.m., GH 226)

It was a shaky time for Christians in the Roman Empire. In A.D. 68 Emperor Nero saw himself surrounded by political enemies and took his own life. In the next year three emperors, in rapid succession, took his place but couldn't hold the job. So in A.D. 69 troops proclaimed the military leader Vespasian as emperor—and saw that he stayed there.

Vespasian hated Jews, and he counted Christians among them. Prior to becoming emperor his goal had been to trample Judea and erase it from existence. As emperor he sent his oldest son, Titus, to finish the job. Titus put Jerusalem under siege for three months. Then he tightened the noose. Troops leveled buildings to the ground. The temple became a crumble of stones. Jerusalem fell. Jews (and Christians) became Roman captives.

Aftershocks vibrated throughout the Roman Empire, blending with the general persecution against “atheists” (people who refused to worship Roman gods) that Nero had begun. Christians everywhere suffered. They were driven from their homes, deported to the outer borders of the empire, forbidden to worship openly and, worse yet, splintered by their own internal doctrinal disputes. It is possible that the apostle Paul was martyred under Nero. And Peter was martyred as well—crucified upside down, tradition says, because he felt unworthy to die in the same position as his Lord. It was a dark season for Christians. How were they to endure?

Peter and Jude, through God's inspiration, sensed this coming darkness. If conservative scholars are correct, Peter's first letter can be dated about A.D. 64, probably written from the city of Rome—which Peter called Babylon in 5:13. Peter's second letter refers appreciatively in 3:15–16 to Paul's letters but bears no hint that Paul is dead. On the other hand, Peter seems to anticipate his own death—soon (see 2 Peter 1:13–14). Scholars therefore date this letter in the sixties as well—but closer to the end of the decade. Jude, the half-brother of Jesus Christ, wrote in the same era. In fact, much of the information in Jude is also found in 2 Peter 2. All three letters aim at preparing Christians for hardship.

But these are not bleak letters. Indeed, they are full of hope and practical counsel on how to endure. They tell us to balance holy living with correct doctrine, to nurture spiritual growth, to work within existing authority structures and to take care of

each other...And so begins Carolyn Nystrom's 1 & 2 *Peter and Jude*, our adult summer Sunday School Bible study. We hope you will join us when you are in town as we meet in Grace Hall 226. Children's Summer Sunday School

This summer children will be broadly graded and divided into two groups for Sunday School. **Preschool** children will be learning about some amazing Bible stories using *Frolic*, and **Elementary (K-5)** children will be learning about the *Armor of God* and *Gross! Bible Stories*. Classes will be taught by volunteers; if you can help, please sign up for a Sunday (signupgenius.com/go/805084CA8AF2AA3FE3-childrens2). Below is a description of the curriculum:

Frolic: Frolic storybooks present common early childhood challenges encountered by the charming Frolic friends. Using the faith practice of prayer, each friend manages the challenge and finds a solution. Included each week are age-appropriate songs to sing and take-home story sheets with stickers. Begins June 4 in SB 102.

The Armor of God: Kids will learn that they need to use all of the parts of the Armor of God if they want to live life the way God wants us too. This is an eight-week program for rising 1st-5th graders in SB 204.

Gross! The Bible is filled with some messy stories – stories that point us to an amazing, loving God. In this series, kids will experience these stories through messy games, crafts, and other activities. This is a four-week program for rising 1st-5th graders in SB 204.

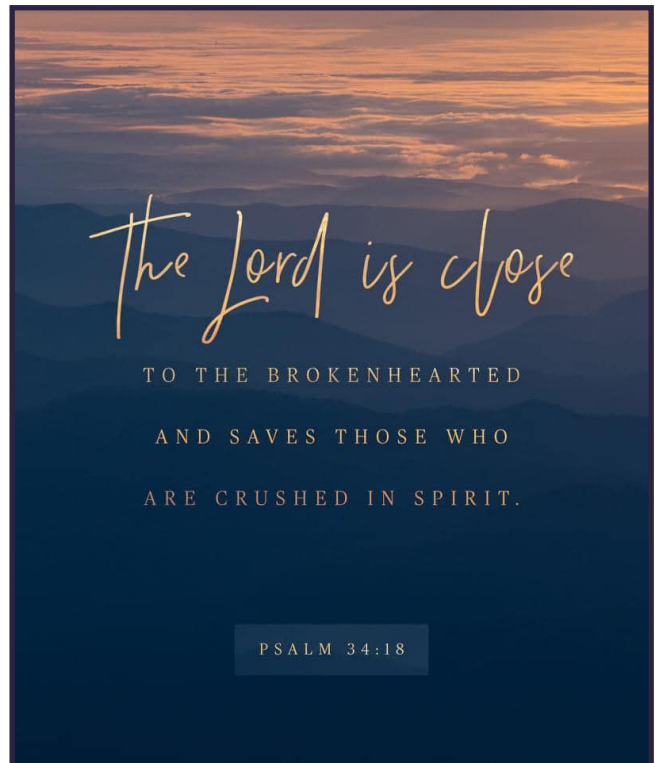

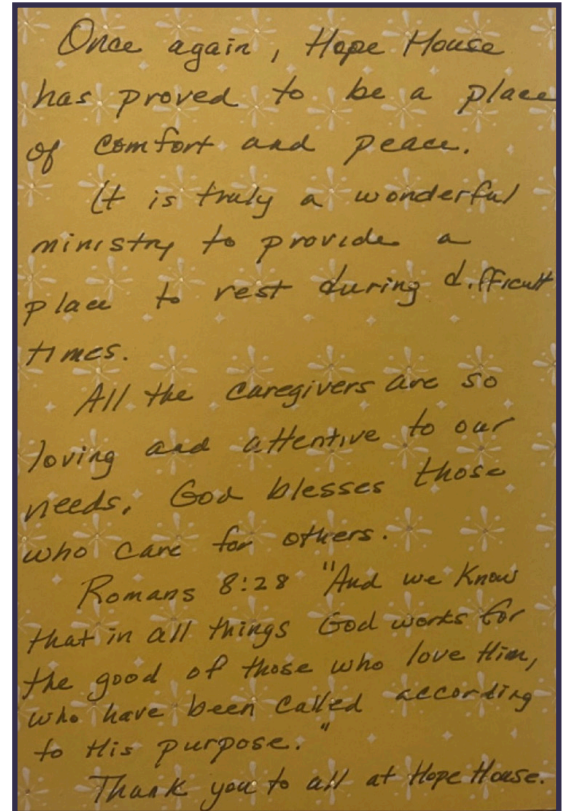
Spreading God's Love

Bites Between Bibles

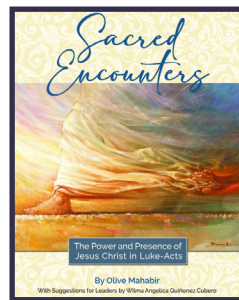
Coffee and Doughnuts offered in the Fellowship Hall
