Sunday School for Adults (9:45-10:45 a.m.)

The Academy of St. John (SB 206) – Searching for the Historical Jesus

Located on the Wondrium website, the Academy of St. John Sunday School class begins this fall watching and studying a fascinating documentary. *Searching for the Historical Jesus* takes you back two millennia to explore the history, context, and character of a humble carpenter who changed the world. Filmed in the Holy Land, each thought-provoking episode (15 total episodes) will bring Jesus and his world to life with vivid detail, offering an excellent companion piece for anyone wrestling with history or with walking in faith. Future studies include an Advent Study *The Journey* (Adam Hamilton), *Listen: Praying in a Noisy World* (Reuben P. Job), and *Painting the Stars: Science, Religion, and an Evolving Faith*.

Connect 3 (Parlor)

The fall Connect 3 begins looking at what we believe as they study the Apostles' Creed using Adam Hamilton's study *Creed*. We're all searching. Sometimes the search is easy: simply type a question and the answer pops up. But sometimes our questions are complicated, and the answers are difficult to see and harder to articulate. How do we discover and examine the truths that give meaning and purpose to life? Adam Hamilton believes that some powerful answers are contained in the Apostles' Creed, an early statement of foundational Christian beliefs. Other studies coming this year in Connect 3 include guest speakers, select *Bible Project* studies, *Heaven & Earth* (Advent Study by Will Willimon), *When Christians Get It Wrong* (Adam Hamilton), *Finding Jesus in the Psalms* (Barbara Roose), and *Living Fully Dying Well* (Rueben Job).

The Middle (GH 226)


Joy Even on Your Worst Days-Wisdom from Philippians by Tom Are, Jr. begins the fall study for The Middle. The world the apostle Paul inhabited was dramatically different from our time. He knew nothing of capitalism, or physics, or Zoom, and more significantly, Paul was a regular in Caesar's prison. For us, "Caesar" is a salad. But a constant in the human story is that every life faces suffering. Paul's life was no different. And yet, on Paul's worst days, he still exhibited a spirit of joy. In this spirit of joy, Paul offers us some inspiration. Joy is not a common reality in modern life. We are more acquainted with anxiety and fear, and on good days we can settle for happiness; but joy is less common. The worst days come to all of us. At some point the dreams die, the body fails, the spirit is crushed. Those days leave their mark on us. But an imprisoned apostle passed down 104 verses to an ancient congregation in Philippi, and they have passed it down to us. It is their testimony that when the worst days come—and they will—they do not have to be the end of joy. Indeed, they might be the beginning.

Youngish Adults (SB 209, aka the Library)

The youngish Adult class looks at *Bible Stories for Grown-Ups* this fall as they consider stories many read as children including Noah's Ark, the binding of Isaac, Jonah and the big fish, Jesus and Zacchaeus, Jesus healing a blind man, and the parable of the talents. Author Josh Scott reimagines these stories and opens new visions for readers to understand well known pieces of Scripture in our current cultural environment. *Altar Ego*, by Craig Groeschel, will take the group from late October into November, and an Advent study will round out the 2023 calendar year.

The 2023–2024 PW/Horizons Bible study, *Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Acts* by Olive Mahabir, invites readers to consider Jesus, “the good shepherd” (Luke 10:15), who shared the Good News through

sacred encounters with everyday people.

The Gospel According to Luke and the book of the Acts of the Apostles, or Luke-Acts “one story in two parts,” demonstrate the unfolding of God’s redemptive purposes in human history and present a distinctive perspective on the person and work of Jesus Christ. Written by Luke, a physician and traveling companion of Paul, the message to the early Christian community (and to us) is radical, inclusive, and hope filled.

Sundays for Children

Childcare is available for toddlers and infants on Sunday mornings during both services and Sunday School. Worship services include 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m., and Sunday School at 9:45 a.m.

PreK (SB 102) – Our youngest children in a Sunday School class get a true overview of great stories in the Bible as they use the child-friendly *Beginners Bible* to see and hear stories that will begin to build a foundation for their faith. Stories include the Creation, Noah's Ark, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Daniel, Deborah, Ruth, Jonah, Elijah, Jesus, Paul, Lazarus, and so many more. And each week, to reinforce the lesson, children will do take-home craft projects and activities that will help him or her engage in the story.

Elementary, Grade K-1 (SB 203), Grade 2-3 (SB 204), Grade 4-5 (SB 205) – Divided into three distinct classes, elementary children learn stories of the Bible through engagement and discussion in the classrooms and in an "opening assembly" where all children hear and see (video) the lesson for the day. The curriculum, *Celebrate Wonder*, is a Sunday school curriculum that engages children's natural sense of curiosity to help them understand God's love. It creates a safe environment for kids to ask big questions — helping them explore the Bible in ways that feed their imagination and encourage creativity. Through carefully selected Bible stories, songs, videos, and hands-on activities, *Celebrate Wonder* gives children the tools to explore their faith while incorporating it into their daily lives. This fall they will explore stories in Genesis.

Kids Praise!

Our "children's church" program meets the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sundays of the month. This worship experience for children, PreK through second grade, will include a story that is based on the weekly Bible reading and activities to help them better understand the message. This volunteer-led experience begins following the children's message during the 11:00 a.m. Service of Worship, when children will head to Kids Praise in GH 122 (Grade 1-2) and GH 121 (PreK 4's-K). At the conclusion of the Service of Worship, parents should pick up their children from the appropriate classroom.

Third Grade Worship

Third Grade Worship is a six-week program designed for our third graders to learn the different components of worship and the basic elements of the sacraments. Our prayer is that they will continue to worship with their families and attend Sunday School weekly. Register on-line through Realm! (Begins Sunday morning, September 17.)



Wednesday Nights for Children: Fruit of the Spirit

Returning to Wednesday evenings this fall is the children's Wednesday program from 4:30-6:00 p.m. Stay tuned for adult study opportunities while the children meet.

Bible Time and Crafts – 4:30-5:30 pm – THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT FOR LITTLE ONES – With fun, colorful illustrations The Fruit of the Spirit for Little Ones engages little ones' minds and hearts to help them remember and use the fruit of the Spirit given to us by God. Galatians 5:22-23 reminds children to have love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. (SB 102)

Jesus and Me (JAM) – 4:30-5:30 PM – THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT- JESUS GROWING IN YOU AND THROUGH YOU - Using hands-on Bible lessons, skits, crafts and Bible games, kids in kindergarten through second grade will have fun learning what it means to have Jesus growing in them and through them! Each week, kids will have an interactive Bible story, crafts (and yummy devotions!) bible games, a tee shirt design, name tag, and Fruit of the Spirit Bingo! (SB 211)

Kid's Alive – 4:30-5:30 pm – TRAVEL GUIDE THROUGH THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT – will take third through fifth graders on life-impacting explorations that engage them with activities, stories, prayer, and much more. Children will learn about expressing God's love to others through caring actions and healthy attitude, with the help of God's Spirit. Incorporated into lessons are games, fun trivia and even souvenirs! (SB 208)



Sunday Nights, 6-7:15 p.m.



Feeling the Loss at Hope House


"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." - Matthew 5:4
