#### **Haiti Outreach Ministry**

Many of you were touched by Pastor Leon's visit a few weeks ago. Pastor Leon challenged us to pray for Haiti and then to do what the Spirit might lead us to do. Many of you have responded to his call already to pray for Haiti and to go above and beyond with financial donations. Pastor Leon was blessed by his time with us.

Several of us from MPPC will be in Raleigh, NC, at White Memorial Presbyterian Church on May 4th, 2024, to celebrate the **35th Anniversary of Haiti Outreach Ministry**'s work in Haiti. I am very excited to celebrate this faithful ministry that continues to educate children, feed the hungry, and provide medical care and clean, safe drinking water amid violence and unrest. Now is not the time to turn our back on innocent children. Now is our time to double our efforts to protect them. We can do this.

So, I also offer you the same challenge that Pastor Leon did!

One, pray for Haiti and HOM's work there. If you do not have one of the HOM prayer cards that were handed out, ask me; I have plenty, or see the prayer on the right.

And if the Spirit moves you to do more, sponsor a child in the HOM school system. Despite all the unrest and violence, HOM schools are running about 80% in attendance. A sponsored child receives a uniform to wear, two meals a day, and free dental and medical care. For \$40 a month, or

\$480 a year, you and your family can give the gift of education to a child. Visit here to find out more: haitiom.denarionline.com/SponsoraChild.

### Welcome Ellen: Commissioned Pastor for Adult Education

We are very pleased to announce that longtime church member

Ellen Creed Branham
has accepted the
part-time position of
Commissioned Pastor for
Adult Education effective
June 1, 2024. Ellen will
assume the adult portion



of the faith formation and Christian education responsibilities of recently retired Director of Christian Education Dan Wiard.

Ellen has been engaged in and served MPPC in many ways over the years, including as an Elder, Stephen Minister, PW Circle leader and Moderator, VBS volunteer, Children's Sunday school teacher, service on the Worship, Christian Education, and Nominating Committees, Faith Formation ministry team, Resource Architect, and small group leader. She's written small group curriculum, taught Missional Life classes, and co-wrote Called to Life: a Missional Way of Being with former MPPC pastor Rev. John Hage. Most recently, she's worked remotely with ordained pastors as a research and planning assistant. Ellen received a Certificate in Theology and Ministry from Princeton Seminary in 2020, completed the Congregational Leadership program at Dubuque Theological Seminary in 2022, and completed course requirements to be a commissioned pastor in the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery at the SC 5 School of Theology in March of 2023.

Ellen is also in the process of entering into a covenant relationship with MPPC and the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery to serve as a Commissioned Pastor which, when approved, will allow her to preach occasionally and provide other pastoral services and support for the congregation. A commissioned pastor is an elder of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), who is granted by the presbytery a local commission for limited pastoral service, to lead worship and preach the gospel, watch over the people, and provide for their nurture and service. Commissioned pastors may also administer the Lord's supper, perform baptisms, perform marriages, and moderate session and congregational meetings.

We hope you will join us in welcoming Ellen as she begins her new adult education and pastoral responsibilities in June.

### MPPC Endowment Corner: Are you "leafing" a legacy?

If you don't know about the Endowment Tree, the tree is a large display in the Fellowship Hall designed to recognize those that are leaving funds to the Endowment at their passing. What is the Endowment?



- The Endowment Fund gives a small percentage of earnings back to the church annually and the principal is only touched in case of a catastrophic disaster.
- The larger the Endowment grows, the larger the annual gift back to the church is.
- The mission is to further the spiritual and charitable purposes of our church.
- Gifts made to the Endowment Program will be fruit for generations to come.
- It is a gift that keeps on giving.

To receive a leaf on the tree, you need to set up your estate documents to leave money to the church at your death. This can be as simple as giving the church a set dollar amount from your IRA or a line item in your will. There are many options and several are quite tax efficient!

#### Paikan Family Update: Approaching Summer





As many of you know, our church along with Providence and Westminster have been providing everyday support to Nadia Paikan, Afghan refugee, and her four children, Sodise 6th grade, Taib 3rd grade, Mobara 4k, and Asra 2 years old. Nadia and the children completed their medical screening for their green card application and that seems to be moving forward. The family is patiently waiting to hear next steps from US Citizenship and Immigration Services regarding Fraidoon's reunification with his

family. Sadly, there seems to be no sense of urgency from the government's perspective nor a timeline the family can track. This situation is truly in God's hands, and we have done all we can do except wait patiently and pray. We are thrilled that Sodise and Taib received several summer camp scholarships which is helping keep the cost of summer camp to a minimum.

Sodise is a bit soccer crazy and thankfully he will have many opportunities to play soccer all over Charleston! Taib will be at St Andrews Park and Playground for the summer. We need drivers to take the boys each day. How you can help:

- 1. Transportation- We will need volunteers this summer to either take the boys to camp in the morning or bring them home in the afternoon. Camp will run from June 10- August 9. Please reach out to Maryanne Davis (maryanne.biddix@gmail.com, 678-620-6029) with any questions or to express interest. We will gladly get you signed up for a ride!
- 2. Financial support—We have a refugee fund at the church that we use to pay for a variety of expenses that are beyond the reach of this struggling family. Checks can be written to MPPC with "refugee fund" in the memo line.
- 3. Prayers—This family is in constant need of your prayers. A single mother with 4 children between the ages of 12 and 2 would keep any prayer group busy. Throw in family reunification delays and cultural assimilation issues, the need for prayers is never ending.
