Often, when a family gets the news that a loved one is in need of intensive medical care, life can feel as if it has been turned upside down. The family begins to put a plan in action to ensure this person has the best care with the best support system, and that means many concerns come to mind. This is especially true if the necessary care is away from home. Hope House has served as a refuge for many families, including a recent guest who shared her experience staying at Hope House while her brother was hospitalized.

This guest described Hope House as a lifesaver. When she walked into the house for the first time, she felt a sense of calm and peace. Instantly, the stress and anxiety of figuring out where they would stay and how they would manage this abrupt change in their daily life, lifted away. This guest attributed these feelings to the helpful volunteers who were so accommodating, as well as the resources available to them at Hope House. The safety and comfort of Hope House allowed the family a place to rest and regroup after difficult days, which helped strengthen them while they cared for their loved one. Having a warm meal to eat, a comfortable bed to sleep in, and a beautiful home to come back to each night eased the stress and strain of a very difficult situation.

Hope House also served as a place for connection during this stay. This guest built a friendship with one of the other guests staying at Hope House and served as a listening ear and a source of comfort for that person. While she was seeking her own comfort and respite, she in turn was able to provide a little comfort to someone else in need. It was a blessing for both guests.

Peace, comfort and love truly are the foundations of the Hope House Ministry. Please continue to pray for our guests, their families, and this ministry.


